Get buy-in from across the business

Form a Lone Worker Project Group with members from different departments to champion the technology and address concerns across the organisation.



Define clear roles & ownership

Set clear roles and responsibilities for safety technology usage. Define who is responsible for what aspects of the system and establish accountability at all levels.



Use data to drive engagement

Use regular reporting to keep safety front of mind. Share usage statistics, success stories, and improvement opportunities in team meetings and company communications.

3. Use Technology as an Enabler



Match the tech to the task

Give employees safety solutions that suit their role, environment and personal preferences.



Make it seamless
